Contextual Safeguarding Risks: Contextual risk refers to events, factors or dynamics occurring in the broader environments which affect Safeguarding of LGBTQ+ Young People YP (media, education, health, training, housing, sports, and judicial system)

Name of organisation: BeLonG To

BeLonG To has completed a contextual risk assessment of the potential for harm to child, young people and vulnerable young adults that are engaged in the organisation and maintains a risk register in relation to this. Furthermore, we capture issues presented through HOMES (Salesforce Database).

Harm in this context is related to assault, ill-treatment or neglect of the child, young person or vulnerable adult that seriously affects or is likely to seriously affect the child, young person's or vulnerable young adults' health, development or welfare, or sexual abuse of the child or young person.

This register identifies all risks of harm to children, young people, and vulnerable young adults in BeLonG To and lists the procedures, policies, programmes and practices that mitigate against and help reduce or eliminate these risks. To the right is a list of the areas of risk identified and the list of the main procedures in BeLonG To for mitigating against these risks.
