Nature of Service & Principles to Safeguard Children from Harm

Belong To is the national organisation supporting lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTQ+) young people in Ireland. Since 2003, we have worked with LGBTQ+ young people between 10 and 23 years, to create a world where they are equal, safe, and valued in the diversity of their identities and experiences. As part of that work, we strive to ensure that children who access our service are safe from harm.

Belong To provides a number of services to LGBTQ+ young people to have access to safe, high-quality youth work groups, services and supports. Our services to young people include the following groups and programmes:

- Weekly youth groups for LGBTQ+ young people aged 14-23. We deliver weekly youth groups for young people from 14-17 and 18-23.
- **New Young Person's Project:** This group occurs both online and in-person on a weekly basis. It is designed for newcomers interested in participating in the projects, offering both virtual and face-to-face opportunities 14-23.
- Youth Information Services: Youth information is provided to young people looking for support and signposting online through enquiries.
- **Specialised and Seasonal Programmes:** we host a number of different short-term projects and preventative programmes throughout the year with young people involved in the service. These programmes also include day trips and overnight residential trips between 10-23.
- **Counselling Service with Pieta:** Pieta provides a free crisis counselling service for LGBTQ+ young people who are based in Ireland.
- One To One Support: For young people with additional needs, the organisation delivers tailored support on an individual basis where appropriate
- **Education and Training:** We provide education and training opportunities within a community, youth and school setting – both primary and post-primary. These services provide direct support to staff and employees to make their organisation/ schools inclusive of LGBTQ+ young people. Programmes such as the Quality Mark are targeted at staff members and young people are engaged directly in the evaluation process.

- **Research and Advocacy:** Young people 14-23 are involved in research and advocacy through focus groups, youth advisor panels and media representation.

This statement has been developed to safeguard children and young people in our service, as well as families, staff and volunteers who engage with Belong To. We also set out a commitment that all children will be equally protected from harm regardless of race, ability, ethnicity, or sexual orientation. The document is based on, and adheres to, the following from Tusla – the Child and Family Agency:

Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children Guidance 2017 and Children First Act 2015

As an organisation, we:

- Recognise that the protection and welfare of children is of paramount importance, regardless of all other considerations;
- Comply fully with our statutory obligations under the Children First Act 2015 and other relevant legislation relating to the protection and welfare of children;
- Co-operate with the relevant statutory authorities in relation to child protection and welfare matters;
- Adopt safe practices to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to children, and protect workers from the necessity to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusations of abuse or neglect;
- Respect in full confidentiality requirements in dealing with child protection matters.
- This Safeguarding Statement is displayed prominently on the Belong To website, our premises and at locations in which we run our groups.

The Safeguarding Statement applies:

- To all staff, interns, students on placement, volunteers, board members, and young people accessing our services.

When working in any premises utilised by the organisation for its activities and for all when working on behalf of, or representing, Belong To. Risk Assessment

Belong To defines risk, as per Section 11 (i)(a) of Children First Act 2015, as “*any potential harm to a child while availing of the service.*”

Section 2 of the act defines harm as follows:

harm means in relation to a child –

(a) assault, ill-treatment or neglect of the child in a manner that seriously affects the child's health, development or welfare or

(b) sexual abuse of the child, whether caused by a single act, omission or circumstances or a series or combination of acts, omissions, or circumstances or otherwise.

Belong To maintains a risk register, which we regularly review. A Risk Register is a risk management tool that is used to identify potential risks that could affect the organisation. We have processes in place where we regularly assess any potential for harm to a child/ young person while availing of our services. Our standard risk assessment is available on request. Below is a list of the areas of risk identified and the list of procedures for managing these risks.

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Procedures

Our Child Safeguarding Statement has been developed in line with requirements under the Children First Act 2015, *Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children* (2017), and Tusla's *Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure and Practice*.

In addition to the procedures listed in our risk assessment, the following procedures support our commitment to safeguard children while they are availing of our service:

- Procedure for the management of allegations of abuse or misconduct against workers/volunteers of a child availing of our service;
- Procedure for the safe recruitment and selection of workers and volunteers to work with children;
- Procedure for provision of and access to child safeguarding training and information, including the identification of the occurrence of harm;
- Procedure for the reporting of child protection or welfare concerns to TUSLA;
- Procedure for maintaining a list of personnel in the service who are mandated persons;
- Procedure for appointing a relevant person.

All procedures listed are available upon request.

We recognise that implementation is an on-going process. Our service is committed to the implementation of this Child Safeguarding Statement and the procedures that support it.
